

How does my life abide and rest in God? What practices/processes encourage this?


AM I experiencing this God-promised abundance?



Will Goodwin, grandson of JoAnn & Rich Goodwin, graduated from University of Louisville with a Bachelor of Art in Music.


Kyle Litwin, son of Amy & Mike Litwin, will be graduating from Wentworth Institute of Technology with a degree in Mechanical Engineering.

A Call Story in Modern(ish) Life:

Fanny Crosby, a Methodist, was born in 1820 and became blind when she was six weeks old. As she grew, she depended on her grandmother, who described the beauty of the world to her and introduced her to the Bible. With the encouragement of a woman named Mrs. Hawley, with whom they both lived, Fanny began memorizing passages from the Scriptures, and the poetry of the book spoke to her. In school, she got in trouble for making up poems; but she could not stop herself. Fanny believed that God had placed a gift within her.

"I seem to have been led, little by little, toward my work; and I believe that the same fact will appear in the life of anyone who will cultivate such powers as God has given them, and then go on, bravely, quietly, but persistently, doing such work as comes to their hands," she said. Crosby became a prolific poet, writing up to seven hymns a day. Her work includes "Pass Me Not, O Gentle Savior" and "Blessed Assurance." When she died at the age of 95, Crosby had written more than 8,000 hymns.

Trustees Update

Hello church family,

It is my pleasure to update you on what the Trustees have done to upgrade where we worship and where we meet to further our fellowship. This letter also asks for assistance and advice on the maintenance of our facilities.

We have beautified the 2nd and 3rd floors, and the office spaces by painting and carpeting them at the cost of \$49,000. If you haven't seen them yet, please talk a walk through. We have also placed some comfortable furniture in the 2nd floor hallway. More will be coming, such as tables, artwork, and some greenery. The office will soon have some comfortable chairs, new artwork and decor, and the receptionist desk will be replaced.

The former Pastor pictures will be placed in the Fellowship Hall with new framing. A picture of our current Pastor will be placed in the office.

The Education Building, much of which is rented out to our neighbors next door, brings much needed revenue to Trustees to further the maintenance of our facilities. There are eleven rooftop air conditioners on this building for which we hold the responsibility. One was replaced in 2013, one in 2018 and in 2020 we replaced two of them at a cost of \$18,000. There are seven originals left, all installed in 1993. We have gotten our money's worth out of them. We have asked for quotes to replace them. This would be a big ticket item. We may end up spacing the replacement out over a few years, replacing the worst of them two at a time.

We have had to patch the roof on both the Education and McCord buildings several times. The Education building needs to be reroofed first. We have incoming quotes for both roofs. This will be a big ticket item.

The drainpipes and gutters need work on Sanctuary and McCord buildings. We have a band-aid quote for drainpipes only and were told that Sanctuary gutters were not in the best of shape. If any of you have any contacts for commercial gutter and drainpipe work please feel free to contact me. Most of the residential companies are not able to perform the work we need. My contact info will be at the bottom of this letter.

Another spot of advice we can use is on sealing the Sanctuary and possibly some mortar work on the bricks. There are three areas that we have seen where paint is bubbling on the walls in the Sanctuary and it seems to be caused by water percolating through the bricks. The company we used to seal the building years ago is now out of business.

The lighting dimmer in the Sanctuary has three control points and only one is now working. If not repairable as is this may be a big ticket item.

We are currently reviewing our investments in the Trust. It is all in CDs and we are looking at investment options to determine if there is a better option.

Lights above the Sanctuary. It is an adventurous climb to go above the Sanctuary to replace the light bulbs. Instead of paying for the service to do so Tre and I do this job. I love going up there to do it as I love the bones of this church. But my days of doing this won't last forever. I am looking for someone that does not have a fear of heights and enjoys a bit of climbing to help in this fun task. I am in my 60s so a couple people a bit younger might be helpful! Please contact me if interested. This is a job that requires two people for safety reasons.

We have a list of items that need repair. Joye has engaged a new handyman and he is working out well. It is a very large list of repairs so may take awhile. If there are any here that are handy and like to fix broken things, please let me know and we can look at the list Joye has.
