# FLORIDA ANNUAL CONFERENCE 200201 A Community of Love & Forgiveness

#### Annual Conference Mpdate

The Florida Annual Conference was held virtually this year, June 11 – 12, featuring a theme of Love and Forgiveness. Pre-conference workshops were offered June 7th-9th and provided insight into some of the initiatives and resolutions presented this year. I was excited to participate in three of these interactive virtual workshops with Linda LaBell participating in two. Even though all sessions were held virtually, you couldn't contain the enthusiasm of members from all over the state gathered together, united in their love and desire to serve a living God.

The Laity session. lead by our Conference Lay Leader Alice Williams, highlighted four distinct elements of laity:

- Purpose- a church driven by spirit-led individuals, democratic based with shared leadership
- Presence faith is not static, it requires action; you can't be on the sidelines
- Partnership ministry is about relationships, building bridges and connecting with others to spread God's love
- Passion- we should be striving to create a world as it ought to be, putting our thoughts and prayers into positive change

Bishop Carter spoke to the theme of Love and Forgiveness, sharing how the communion table represents God's love and the cross His forgiveness for our sins. The UMC cross and flame reminds us to be a community of love and forgiveness and to focus on being the light. He talked about the church as a "big tent", where all are loved and welcome to receive the grace of Jesus Christ; and that unity cannot be at someone's expense. In our journey towards holiness, we need connection to keep love alive.

The 2020 Fill the Table Initiative resulted in 5 million meals being distributed, demonstrating the impact we have when we work together and follow Jesus' directive to love our neighbors. You can take pride in this accomplishment as our Wednesday dinners were a part of those 5 million meals.



#### Annual Conference Update continued

During the business sessions, the budget, which was reduced by 5%, was approved. This is the third year in a row where the budget has been reduced which in turn reduces the apportionments we pay as a local church. The conference continues to examine expenses as they continue to work towards being fiscally responsible.

Other business items voted on during the conference were:

- Sale of Episcopal Residence this is the housing provided for the bishop; a housing allowance will replace the home
- Option for Co-Lay Leader Structure designed to share the leadership responsibilities of the lay leader

Six resolutions were voted and approved; full details on each resolution can be found on the Florida Methodist Conference website, FLUMC.org/ac. Look for "voting items" on the left panel. "Resolutions express our Church community's beliefs and give us evidence that the Church means for God's love to reach into situations faced each day, not just on Sunday mornings. Not all of us are intimately involved with each issue, but someone, somewhere, is." If you have any questions about these resolutions please feel free to contact me and I will be glad to discuss with you.

The conference also voted to close six churches and disaffiliate three. I personally found this difficult as one of the churches closed was started by my former father-in-law. It is always moving to attend the memorial and retirement services that honor our clergy and their spouses.



I was especially excited to watch the service of commissioning for Provisional Elders as two of the individuals were approved through the NE District Committee on Ordained Ministry (DCOM). I was privileged to be part of the team that worked with Margaret Odom Tomkins and Katie Harrington as they prepared for approval for Provisional Elder. Please keep them in your prayers as they continue their journey towards ordination.

I came away from the conference filled with hope. As a connectional church we make a commitment to one another to work together to spread God's love. It is together, in this connection that we can light a fire that can change our local communities and even the world.
