

RIVERSIDE REPORTER: JUNE 2022

The first Sunday of June celebrates the day of Pentecost (Acts 2:1-21) when the Holy Spirit pours out on the early church--bringing passion and even language for mission and ministry that follows Jesus. We received the Spirit in order to serve the world in the name of Christ.

This story is in our sanctuary, too: our Pentecost window shows the holy spirit descending like a dove, pouring out over the disciples gathered in the center circle (each with tongues of fire over their heads) -- and the Spirit of God is over the missional work that moves out toward the corners around them.

- Upper left of center: Stephen kneels in witness and martyrdom (Acts 7:54-60)
- Upper right of center: Saul's conversion strikes him blind on the Damascus Road and his life (and name) are changed (Acts 9:1-19)
- Lower left of center: Peter preaches while Mark takes notes and assembles the earliest of the written Gospels (Acts 2:14-42)
- Lower right of center: Paul stands before a map of the Mediterranean churches he visited for the sake of evangelism (Acts 13-14)

And over all of these moments (at the very top beside the dove) we see scenes from the Emmaus story where Jesus breaks bread and walks beside us -even in ways we may not recognize.

May this also be our church's story today: We received the Spirit in order to serve the world in the name of Christ.

June 9-11th, Florida United Methodist Churches will again gather in-person for the 2022 annual conference. This year's theme is "Rebuilding the Church, Remembering the Body" and Beth Joyner is our church's elected delegate to the Lakeland gathering. Look for more updates when she returns.

A 'bishops offering' will be collected to support two mission funds: one to provide technology grants for rural, small membership churches in florida and a second to support "Encounter with Christ in Latin America and the Caribbean" (a permanent fund which provide grants for ministries in this region that empower evangelization, leadership development, ministries with youth and children, and ministries with persons of indigenous culture). Connectional giving like this allows RPUMC to participate in global missions abroad and local-to-florida work in rural areas. Thus, supporting our Acts 1:8 call to be witnesses of Christ "in [cities like] Jerusalem, in [regions like] Judea and Samaria, and to the ends of the earth.'




