Finance Update

As of Jan 1, 2023, we have received 76 pledges totalling \$273,520. Thank you to all who submitted a pledge card, declaring your financial support for RPUMC and of being an essential part of its ministries and God's work in our community and beyond. Your generosity is the foundational support of our life-impacting ministries. The act of pledging, while being an individual/family spiritual discipline, also



assists Staff Parish - Finance Committee members and other church leaders in planning and budgeting for all our 2023 ministry areas and expenses. Every gift, no matter the amount, counts and when combined together helps toward fulfilling our mission to empower others to live life abundantly in Christ.

Last year we received 78 pledges for a total of \$296,882. This year's current pledge total thus represents a reduction of \$23,362 in income that Staff Parish-Finance will have available for ministry and operational expenses in 2023. We recognize and understand that 2022 was challenging for many households, with costs for essential living expenses rising substantially, coupled with likely losses in retirement accounts due to market turbulence. Our church finances were impacted in similar ways, with unprecedented increases in utility costs and ever rising insurance fees. Our expenses outpaced giving and other income, which resulted in a significant budget deficit for 2022. Fortunately, we were able to manage this gap by taking assets from our reserve funds and were able to maintain all ministry area funding levels. However, our ability to continue to draw from reserves is limited. We anticipate again being challenged in 2023 by cost increases primarily or completely outside our control. In order to fully support our ministry programs and cover all the needed expenses in 2023, we need more support.

We ask that you prayerfully reflect on how you can support our church through your financial gifts and help ensure our vital ministry work continues unabated. If you have not returned a pledge card for 2023, please consider doing so - it is never too late. If you have made a pledge, please consider if you are able to do a little more. Together, and with God's abounding love and help, we will meet this challenge and excitedly look forward to continuing our mission in 2023.

Prayer: Almighty and gracious God, we thank you for all the blessings freely bestowed upon us. We know you have provided, are providing, and will provide. Help us Lord as we face the unknown of what 2023 will bring and know that through it all you are with us.

Church Renovation Project

Phase 1



Our church renovation and repairs are underway! The first phase of power washing the exteriors of the Sanctuary & McCord building began on January 17, 2023 (the second phase will be roof & gutter repair, and the third phase will be HVAC repair/replacement). To reiterate, the trustees have obligated \$477,000 from our foundation trust fund for this project (the total cost is \$801,300). The trustees transferred the 25% down payment (\$200,314) to Johnson Controls on December 28, 2022, so work could begin. The Florida United Methodist Foundation approved a \$499,000 loan for our church on January 10, 2023, which will be used to help finance the remaining balance. We got a second quote for the seven bathrooms renovation project and hope to select a contractor in February. The trustees (along with finance committee representatives) will begin meeting in February to discuss growth options for the remaining \$100,000 of our foundation trust fund. Bottom line, there are a lot of moving parts associated with the renovation

and repairs, and the trustees will continue to work

Phase 2 is scheduled to begin in early February. This includes gutter and roof repair/replacement for the McCord building and sanctuary.



Phase 3

Phase 3 will being later in the year due to supply chain issues. On the roof of the education building, seven of the eleven HVAC units will be replaced. The framework for all 11 units will be replaced with curbs to prevent rust and water intrusion.



We plan to meet at 1:00 PM in the library to talk about this heartwarming book.


Please bring one or two books that you would recommend for future meetings. The Jacksonville Public Library has multiple copies of many books so we should be able to borrow copies for Book Club.
