

TRUSTEES UPDATE

Your Trustees are happy to report the church's renovation and repairs project is proceeding smoothly. The first scope-exterior pressure washing and sealing is complete. The second scope--roofing, gutters, and downspouts is currently underway and scheduled to be complete on or about May 8th. Our final scope, HVAC, is scheduled to begin August 9th. The total project completion date looks like October 31st. JEA approved a \$1,050 rebate for our church's energy efficiency improvements. We have paid the down payment

for the bathrooms renovation and work will begin shortly. The Trustees continue to develop a fundraising campaign concept that we hope to initiate this summer (initial plans to the right). Lastly, two big shout outs to a) Danny Marks for squaring away our two overhead projectors in the sanctuary; and b) Dago Quiros, our fantastic handyman, (and Tre Devine) for installing safety rails in the sanctuary's attic, making it a lot safer to do any work up there.

Timmy Jackson has played trumpet in our traditional worship service. You may recognize him as the son of "Tim the drummer" from the praise team. For this contest, Timmy composed a musical tribute in memory of the students killed last year in Uvalde, Texas. Timmy's piece will eventually be performed live by a full UNF ensemble, but its first live premier will be played by our organist, Rich Lewis. During the traditional service on Sunday, May 21st (close to a year after the tragic shooting at Robb Elementary School) Timmy's award-winning memorial composition will premier on our Riverside Park UMC organ as a musical tribute.

Special thanks to Timmy and to Rich for making this possible.

Tim Bush, we are grateful for your leadership and your servant's heart!

On Sunday, April 23rd, we announced in worship that Tim Bush has decided to step back from his official position as our RPUMC lay leader.



RACIAL JUSTICE TEAM



Palms Presbyterian, Riverside Presbyterian and South Jacksonville are partnering to bring two screenings of Carolyn Crowder's *At the River* to Jacksonville in May. The following information is from the filmmaker's electronic press kit.

At The River is a feature length documentary about a certain time and place in the deep south. In the Civil Rights era of the 50's and 60's many Presbyterian ministers stood on the banks of the cultural river of segregation and white supremacy. They opted not to stir the waters in their congregations and communities by speaking out. However, a few young southern Presbyterian ministers did brave those currents through their sermons, community organizing, and participating in marches and protests.

They faced dangerous, hate-filled consequences for these actions.

At The River chronicles their lives and their decisions, as well as director Carolyn Crowder's first-hand experience as a young white southern girl from Montgomery, Alabama. During those mean and turbulent times these ministers, through their love and example, had a huge impact on her life in helping her overcome her southern racist brainwashing.

At the River has been screened at churches across the Southeast. These will be the first screenings in Florida - on Wednesday May 10 at South Jacksonville and on Thursday May 11 at Palms. Carolyn Crowder will introduce the film at both events. Doors will open at 5:30 pm with the screening beginning promptly at 6:30 pm.

Admission is free for both events, however guests should register by May 5 for the screening that they plan to attend. The film is appropriate for youth age 16 and older.
