



Annual Conference 2023

May the God of hope fill you with all joy and peace in believing, so that you may abound in hope by the power of the Holy Spirit. (Rom. 15:13)

Abound in Hope was this year's Annual Conference theme and over the two and a half days, you could feel the sense of hope, joy and love shared by all the guest speakers and participants. This was the first Annual Conference with Bishop Berlin presiding.

The following is a summary of the Annual Conference; you can obtain details and view the various sessions by going online to flumc.org/ac. Details of all the reports can be found in the Annual Conference Workbook.

Annual Conference Offering-This year, two offerings were collected to support the Rev. Geraldine Williams McClellan Endowment Scholarship at Gammon Theological Seminary and The Warren Willis Camp and Conference Center.

Finances-The Conference approved an overall budget of \$14,071,197 for 2024, which amounts to a reduction of \$2,071,225 from the previous year's budget. Additionally, Conference Treasurer Craig Smelser reported that:

- 375 churches gave 100% of apportionments in 2022 (RPUMC was one of them)
- The Cabinet approved \$2.7M in direct grants to local churches for new ministry initiatives through the New Church Development Fund and Cabinet Development Fund for 2023
- The reduction to the 2024 budget is in anticipation of the financial impact caused by the departure of the churches seeking disaffiliation. The current projection for the impact on the Conference apportionment base that disaffiliations will cause is approximately 30% (Apportionments will not be raised for remaining UMC churches)

General Conference Delegation-The chairs of the General Conference Delegation reported that the 2020 General Conference was postponed until 2024 due to the COVID pandemic. General Conference will take place April 23-May 3, 2024, in Charlotte, NC with delegates elected in 2019 serving.

Laity Session -This year's Laity Session included highlights in district ministry, an update on the future of United Methodist Men in Florida, a campus ministry panel and recognition of certified lay ministers.

Licensing & Ordination Services-Eleven people were licensed as Local pastors; four were commissioned as provisional deacons; 20 were commissioned as provisional elders; three were ordained as deacons and nine were ordained as elders. This included the class of 2022.

Local Churches -Churches celebrating 25-200 years anniversaries were recognized, even churches that elected to disaffiliate.

Memorial Recognition- The Service of Remembrance for the clergy and clergy spouses who died in the last year featured a sermon from Rev. David McEntire.

Resolutions- The following resolution was affirmed by the Conference: In Support of Creating a U.S. Regional Conference.

Retirement Recognition- The conference noted the long and dedicated service of 38 pastoral leaders who move on to retirement. They represent a combined total of 1072 years of service.

Bible Study- This year's conference featured two bible studies featuring Dr. Carla Works, a New Testament Scholar from Wesley Theological Seminary.

All worship services will be in-person and streamed live on Facebook. Please check the website or the RPUMC Family group on Facebook for any updates. Worship service videos will be posted on YouTube and the church website the following business day.
