December is a month of joyful awe and wonder, with endless opportunities for cozy activities and festivities. Especially at the very start of the month, I can't wait to drink cocoa and bake cookies, hang lights, setup nativities, light advent candles...

I LOVE worship during Advent and Christmas Eve, but the honest truth is that the calendar and the rush often get away from me. If I'm not careful, "peace and joy" end up feeling more like additional things to do.

I am always tempted to rush through the calendar and accomplish all the lists—only to realize that I haven't been truly present through any of it. Which is a shame. Because the whole point of the season is to recognize and be present with God who shows up for the world. The point is to be present with one another. To be present through the calendar WITH the peace of Christ... Not the other way around.

Countercultural to the RUSH of December, advent slows us down--preparing our hearts so that we can be truly present through each moment of joy and awe and peace. As a spiritual practice, this is called "practicing the presence of God." It means examining our hearts so that we can reject Hallmark's carefully marketed and idealized idea of Christmas, so that—instead—we can settle into the authentic reality of what Christmas IS: God's presence in the reality of our world. We are invited to gather together and show up for each other through the waiting of the prophets, through the hoping of the annunciation and the long long (likely uncomfortable) journey to Bethlehem... Because THIS is the reality in which God chooses to show up.

The phrase "God with us" (Emmanuel) reminds us that Jesus came to earth to be with us, to share in our joys and sorrows, and to show us the way to love and serve one another. As we journey through this Advent season, may we open our hearts to the presence of Jesus in our midst and, as we are ushered into God's presence, find ourselves filled with hope, with peace, with joy, and with love. The Lord be with you!

hosted by Women in Mission




### Blue Christmas Service December 20th - 6:30 p.m. Chapel (3rd Floor McCord Bldg.)

## Grace Gallery

Although I have lived more than fifteen years in Jacksonville, the natural beauty of Northeast Florida can still take my breath away. The variety of ecosystems in this region is precious and rare. I "paint my love" for both well-known scenes like Jacksonville Beach and quirky spots most people pass without noticing like views of Little Pottsburg Creek from local two-lane roads.

Each painting is based on an actual place and time of day in a particular season. I take numerous reference photos to record everything from the larger context surrounding the intended scene down to the small details of tree bark or reflections in water. On-site sketches and notes about color variations, light quality, and other details supplement the photos.

Back in the studio, I sketch possible compositions, plan the placement of lights and darks, and experiment with possible palettes. I prefer using a limited palette of about 5 to 7 basic tube colors plus white and sometimes black to achieve harmony and unity in each piece. An amazing range of blends can result. The palette varies from one work to another to fit the season, place, and mood

The paintings reflect my delight in our stunning variety of ecosystems and waterways. From the late winter salt marsh, to the lush summer foliage by a languid creek, to the inspiring vistas along the St. Johns River and ocean beaches—I treasure it all and hope we have the wisdom to preserve it all. I hope you enjoy the paintings and say of a scene, "I want to be there!"

## Trustees Update







The trustees are pleased to announce our church's renovation & repair project is complete. From April 3 to October 31 we contracted Johnson Controls to a) pressure wash & seal our buildings exterior; b) replace & repair roof gutters, downspouts, coping metal, and silicone seal roofs; c) replace & install 7 new HVACs on our education center building and get HVAC pedestals mounts, wiring, and fuses all within code; and d) renovate 7 bathrooms. The total cost came to \$881K. The completed renovation & repairs put our church's infrastructure on a solid foundation for the next 15 years.



Every First Sunday and during the entire month of November, we collect nonperishable food items to donate to our community's food pantry at Trinity Lutheran Church. 




## blessing of the animals

## KIDS CHOIR & KIDS CLUB





We are organizing a 28-day prayer experiment to kick-off 2024. Join with Andy Scully (our nominee for Lay Leader) and Pastor Emily and at least 12 others in the church. Participants will receive a free copy of Dynamite Prayer, which provides a scripture, a brief reading, and a daily prayer challenge for four weeks. From Jan 1st to January 28th, Participants will be expected to engage daily with the reflections and prayers, check weekly with assigned prayer partners (groups of three—via text, zoom, or in-person), and meet twice with the larger group to share insights.
