

This month, we finish the season of Lent. We walk through Holy Week—following the footsteps of Jesus who leads us to the cross and the grave and into the resurrection story of Easter Sunday.

For me: it's the resurrection that takes the sting out of death. It's the promise of Christ's victory that silences the fear of failure or uncertainty. When I remember that we ARE resurrection people, I'm more confident in spaces that need hope ("The Spirit of God, who raised Jesus from the dead, lives in you." —Romans 8:11). Because Jesus walked out of the grave that first Easter morning (when it was still dark), I am able to trust and cry out to God whenever I'm grieving now.

Because he lives, I can face tomorrow.

Because he lives, all fear is gone.

Because I know he holds the future,

Life is worth the living just because he lives.

I hope that each of you will share your own reflection:

How does the resurrection of Jesus impact your life? How has your life been resurrected (transformed) because of Christ's

resurrection? Answers can be anonymous. Our hope is to send everyone home on Easter Sunday with a devotional from these responses, so send your thoughts to the church office by Palm Sunday, March 24th.

Tips For Inviting Friends

Easter and Palm Sunday are great excuses to invite others to worship God with us. (To be fair: everySunday is a good time, but special occasions).

How to invite someone to church:

- 1. Pray about it first. Ask God to help you find the words and notice the opportunity. (Even just confessing to God that it might feel awkward is a great prayer!) Pray that any invite would be genuine—out of care for the person and love for Jesus.
- 2. Be relational. Don't yell at random people from the side of the road. The means should match the message, so DO invite people who know that you care about them. And DO allow people to say 'no' without judgment.
- 3. Ask if they would like to go WITH you. Don't throw out a vague and open invite. Offer specifics: "I'll meet you just inside the main doors on Park Street" or—even better— offer to meet before or after for a meal or coffee.
- 4. Share what you love about our church. (I usually say that the music is great and the people are warm —or if they have kids, I tell them that kids are genuinely welcome.)
- 5. Answer questions (or check in to see if they have questions). What to wear, where to park, what to bring, what to expect—these can all be overwhelming for a first experience. Part of hospitality is taking away as much of the unknown as possible.

In all things, remember that the goal is to invite people into the love of Christ, not just the Church.



3 Ways to Welcome:

- 1. Make room in the parking lot. Park further away than you would normally park.
- 2. Expect guests. Look for them. Say hi to a new person before saying hi to your friends.
- 3. Say goodbye after the service, also.

DEEPER SPIRITUAL PURPOSE: by Ava Manalo, Co-youth delegate to Church Council **ROCK THE UNIVERSE TRIP**

This year, one of the values we're looking to cultivate as a church is deeper spiritual growth. Spiritual growth is a pivotal element in every person's walk with Christ, as it allows us to mature in our faith and deepen our relationship with God. But how do we measure it? Growth looks different for everyone. So, we decided to have some conversations with individuals about how they've experienced growth and we're sharing their stories through monthly reflections in the newsletter.



In these reflections, we can find evidence of what walking with God looks like for different people. Hopefully, this encourages and inspires you to examine your spiritual life and look for opportunities to grow in love.

In January, our youth group took a trip to Universal to partake in their annual Christian music festival "Rock the Universe." For most, it was their first time attending, and they came back with stories to tell. Here's what a few of them had to say:

- > 18-year-old Anthony Strong enjoyed his time at Rock the Universe. He had a lot of fun on the trip, especially through getting to "hang out with the other youth." For him, one of the most impactful moments at Rock the Universe was seeing the sheer volume of people there; hundreds and hundreds of Christians gathered in one place. "To see that many Christians in one place was powerful," he said. "Definitely a powerful thing to experience." While Anthony didn't feel any major shift in faith, he agreed this was a moment that helped him connect to God, as he waits for the Lord to move in his life.
- > 13-year-old Kara Manning had a somewhat different experience that both strengthened her bond with her friends in youth and helped draw her closer to the Lord. She said, "That trip made me realize that you really can include God in everything you do." This newfound attitude is something she is beginning to embrace in her day-to-day life. Previously, she said she had been "too scared to talk about God with my friends at school," but this is something she's working to change. She noted a conversation she recently had with a friend about the value of faith: "Sometimes it's hard to believe [in God], but we both still do anyways." Now that she knows just how present the Lord is in the world around her, she is working on "trying to see the best thing in every single situation" as a Lenten discipline.

"Deeper Spiritual Purpose" Reflections Each month, we will ask for "deeper spiritual purpose" reflections. This can be anything—"the deeper spiritual purpose of purple during Lent" or "the deeper spiritual purpose of using your blinker while driving." The whole point is to seek spiritual depth in our ordinary actions ("Seek and you shall find."—Matthew 7:7-8) and share it with others—so that all of us can grow ("As iron sharpens iron, so one person sharpens another." Proverbs 27:17). If you HAVE a reflection to share (or a person/topic to recommend)—contact the church office.

Conference News Updates

In April of this year, the General Conference will meet in Charlotte, NC. Normally, the General Council meets every four years, however, due to COVID, the 2020 General Conference was postponed and will now meet from April 23 – May 3. The following bullet points provide information about the General Conference as well as information about some of the impacts of disaffiliation to the Florida Annual Conference.

Upcoming dates to remember:

- General Conference: 4/23 5/3; Charlotte, NC; the theme: ...and KNOW that I am GOD
- Annual Conference: 6/6 6/8; Lakeland, FL; the theme: Come, Holy Spirit, Come

District Updates:

- Retirement Celebration: 5/18, Our District Superintendent, Rev. Durwood Foshee will be retiring and RPUMC will be hosting his retirement celebration. Please save the date and find out how you can help.
- District Realignments: districts will be reduced from eight to six.
- Conference Budget Realignment: Conference Ministries will be impacted due to cuts in the conference budget. Local and District support for these ministries is encouraged.

General Conference Background and News

- There are 1,100 valid petitions for consideration at the General Conference this year.
- Most legislation brought before the General Conference requires only a simple majority of delegates to pass; however, amendments to the constitution requires a two-thirds vote followed by a two-thirds vote of the lay and clergy members present at annual conferences.
- One of the key legislation pieces being considered is Regionalization, restructuring of the world-wide structure of the church.
- Legislation approved by the General Conference and ratified by the Annual Conferences will take effect January 1, 2025, unless otherwise specified. However, amendments to the constitution only take effect after the Council of Bishops certifies their ratification. In practice, that means any new amendment will not take effect until the bishops meet in Spring 2026.
- A pre-conference zoom meeting on 4/2 at 6:00 p.m. and a post-conference meeting on 5/7 at 6 p.m. will be held to share General Conference information.



Matthew 25:35-36 is the verse that our ministry is founded on and we quote often. Another verse found in every gospel and elsewhere in the New Testament because it is a commandment from Jesus:
